What would I be doing? Manufacturing occupations include the hands-on jobs that do the actual building and shaping of products. This may be done by using tools or by keeping production machinery in good repair. Common responsibilities in this field may include operating sophisticated equipment, assembling products, and repairing machinery.

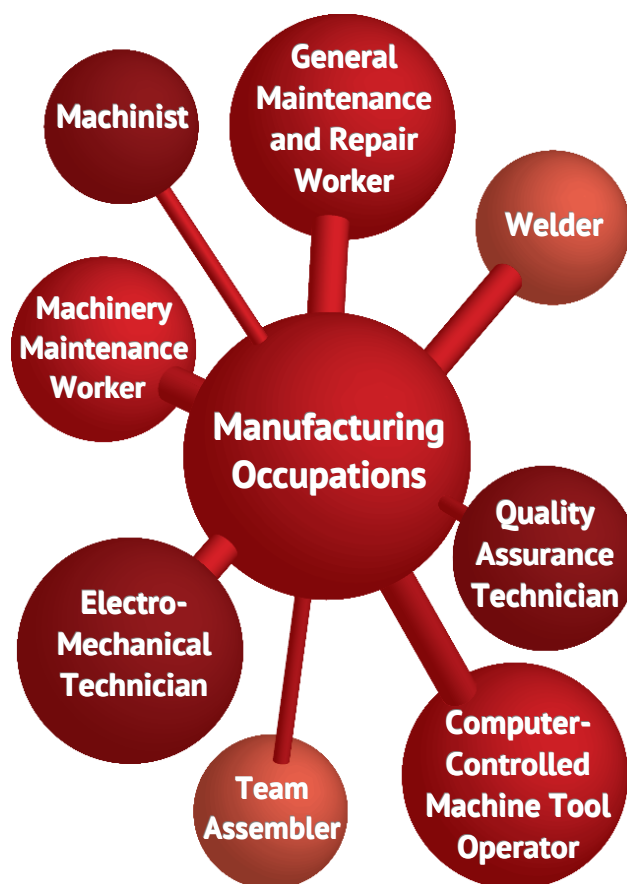
How much money could I be earning? Manufacturing occupations pay well once you've gained the needed training and experience. Team Assemblers can make up to \$21 an hour, and Machinery Maintenance Workers can end up at \$30 an hour without requiring any more formal schooling.

Where would I be working? Manufacturing occupations are found in factories, machine shops, and production plants of all kinds.

Is this a growing field? This field is expected to grow 4.9% in Northwest Indiana through 2022 with 575 new jobs, and many current workers in this field are expected to retire soon, opening up existing jobs to new talent.

What skills should I have? To work in this field, you must be good at working with your hands. Someone who pays close attention to detail and who can perform repetitive tasks and follow procedures will also do very well.

What education or training do I need? While many positions say they accept those with high school diplomas or equivalents, further training or certification can open the door to more opportunities with employers. WorkOne can help by providing the training you need to get hired.

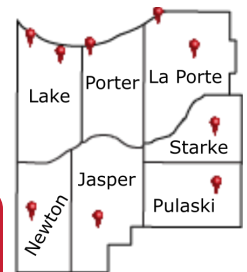
What else will my employer expect? According to our survey of 100 area employers, the top ten traits that they expect of their employees are:
